European Masters Games 2023 offers each athlete the opportunity to compete in a maximum of three sports (five disciplines) at the Games.

COMPETITION SPORTS AND DISCIPLINES

The events and age categories for Futsal at EMG2023 are as follows:

Sport	Disciplines	Competition Format	Age Categories
Futsal	5 vs 5	Open	Men`s: 35+, 55+

The age of the youngest registered team member determines which age category the team will compete in and for the Games, your age is determined as at 31 December 2023.

If there are insufficient number of entries in an age category, categories may be combined in order to conduct a good quality competition. The awarding of medals will not be affected, meaning that individuals will still be awarded medals in the age category in which they originally entered.

COMPETITION DETAILS

Competition rules

Competitions will be conducted under the rules and regulations of the FIFA Futsal Laws of the Game regulations and will conform to any special requirements of the International Masters Games Association (IMGA).

For all which is not specifically prospected in the current regulations, the FIFA regulations, are valid and applied.

Team Details

There are no restrictions on the number of teams registering from one country as the 2023 Futsal European Masters Games is not a nationality based competition and the competitors do not represent their country of origin.

The minimum number of players registered per futsal team is 7 players and the maximum number of players registered for the Games is unlimited. A team may have a maximum of four non-playing staff registered per team. However, a team is only permitted to have a maximum of 14 players registered on the team sheet for any one game.

Team Sheets

Fifteen minutes before the beginning of the match, the team manager should hand over to the referee a signed team sheet with the names of the players, captain, team manager and all the other people who are allowed to enter the playing field, together with the Accreditation Passes of all the team members.

At the start of each match the referee will identify players by the details given on the match sheet and ensure they are wearing the correct number vest.

It is each team's responsibility to be ready for kick off at the scheduled time. All players taking to the field must be eligible to play and must be correctly listed and signed on the team sheet. A minimum of 3 players is required to start the game.

In the event that a team is not present for the kick off of their match, the game will be deemed a forfeit and the opposing team will receive three points with the match being recorded as a 3-0 victory for the opposing team. In this case, the result of the match is calculated in the goal difference.

Referees

The Organizing Committee for the uniformity of the games will guarantee the presence of referees for each programmed match.

Infringements and sanctions

Disciplinary Committee

The Committee will be responsible for any decisions concerning incidents, fouls, and discipline during the tournament.

Sport Justice official documents are:

- Referee's official report
- Official report of Competition Management's representative
- Official communications

If a player is sent off he will automatically be disqualified for the next match, unless other disciplinary measures are taken.

The results, rankings, sports justice disciplinary measures from the board and other communications will be published at the end of every competition day.

All decisions taken by the Disciplinary Committee are final.

Complaints and appeals

Any complaints (only regarding the irregular position of the players actually playing in the match) must be handed over to the referee, signed by the team manager of the team, 15 (fifteen) minutes before the end of the match they refer to.

Competition format

There will be a round robin tournament, followed by a series of elimination finals.

The matches will last 2 equal periods of 20 minutes, with a 5 minutes half time interval.

For pool matches, teams will be awarded three points for a win, one point for a draw and zero points for a loss.

Ties in standings will be resolved based on the following:

- a. Goal difference
- b. Head-to-head result
- c. Goals for
- d. Coin flip

In the elimination finals, if the match is a draw it will proceed directly to kicks from the 6m penalty spot (a series of 5 penalties per team; in case of a further draw it will proceed indefinitely to play penalties until one of the teams is the winner).

- Teams can expect to play a minimum of three games for the duration of the competition.

Medals

In European Masters Games, the athletes do not represent their country of origin, therefore the prize-awarding ceremonies will be carried out without hoisting of flags. No National Anthem of the winning team will be played. The medals will be provided by the Organizing Committee.

Technical meeting

A Technical Meeting will take place before the start of the competitions in order to introduce the competitions, remind those involved of the regulations and the behavior that is expected.

Personal accident insurance and medical certificate

It is the participant's own responsibility to take out adequate and valid accident and health insurance. The competitor registration fee does not cover personal accident insurance.

Anti-doping

The IMGA has adopted an anti-doping policy in line with the WADA (World Anti-Doping Agency) code, which means that testing will be conducted during the games. Each participant must comply with and independently consent to the IMGA Anti-Doping policy <https://imga.ch/masters-sports/anti-doping/>.

EQUIPMENT

The Organizing Committee will provide balls for competition.

Teams are advised to bring their own balls for training.

Teams are advised to bring their own water bottles. Every team will provide for its own medical necessities (plasters, elastic bandages, dry ice, ice spray, band tape, etc); the Organizing Committee will not provide such material.

Individuals are responsible for the safekeeping and storage of their own equipment and personal belongings. The Organizing Committee will not be responsible for any shortages and/or theft.

UNIFORMS

The Organizing Committee will not provide the sports uniforms for the competition.

Each team should supply the necessary sports uniforms in order to be able to participate in the Futsal Tournament.

All teams are required to wear appropriate uniforms. All competitors on the same team must wear team uniforms of the same color that have clearly visible numbers on the back, with numbers not to be duplicated.

All teams must nominate a 'home' and 'alternative' strip. The alternative strip must not clash in any way with the home strip (this includes shirts, shorts and socks). All first named teams as it appears on the official tournament draw will be deemed the 'home team' and therefore play in their nominated 'home' strip. It is the responsibility of the visiting team to change into their 'alternative' strip should there be a clash in colors in any game.

Goalkeepers should have a different colored vest from their teammates and opponents.

Each captain must wear an armband.

FURTHER INFORMATION

Planning for the EMG2023 competition will continue throughout 2022 and spring 2023. Additional sport specific information will be communicated to registered participants and this Sports Information Guide will be updated according to possible changes.
